Ottawa, 21 December 2006

Call for comments on the proposed addition of Cubavision Internacional to the lists of eligible satellite services for distribution on a digital basis

1. The Commission received a request dated 24 October 2006 from Videotron Ltd. (Videotron) for the addition of Cubavision Internacional, a non-Canadian third-language service, to the lists of eligible satellite services for distribution on a digital basis (the digital lists). Videotron described the service as follows:

Cubavision Internacional is a general interest service offering programming from Cuba entirely in the Spanish language, 24 hours per day, 7 days per week. It will offer a broad range of programming, including news, documentaries, lifestyle/human interest, sports, drama and music/variety genres.

2. *In Improving the diversity of third-language television services – A revised approach to assessing requests to add non-Canadian third-language television services to the lists of eligible satellite services for distribution on a digital basis*, Broadcasting Public Notice CRTC 2004-96, 16 December 2004 (Public Notice 2004-96), the Commission set out its revised approach to the assessment of requests to add non-Canadian third-language television services to the digital lists, as well as specific information that Canadian sponsors must file in support of their requests. The Commission will assess Videotron's request in light of the approach set out in Public Notice 2004-96.

Call for comments

3. The Commission calls for comments on Videotron's request for the addition of Cubavision Internacional to the digital lists. Parties submitting comments on the request should also submit a true copy of their comments to the Canadian sponsor, Videotron, at the following address:

4. Proof that comments have been sent to Videotron must accompany the original version of the comments sent to the Commission.
5. Comments on Videotron's request must be received by the Commission no later than **29 January 2007**. A copy of the comments must be received by Videotron no later than the deadline for receipt of comments by the Commission.
6. Videotron may file a written reply to any comments received concerning its request. This reply should be filed with the Commission, and a copy sent to the person who submitted the comments, by no later than **13 February 2007**.
7. The Commission will not formally acknowledge comments. It will, however, fully consider all comments and they will form part of the public record of the proceeding, provided that the procedures for filing set out below have been followed.
