PREAMBLE

Items 1 to 13

On 13 March 2008, the Commission issued Broadcasting Public Notices CRTC 2008-21 and CRTC 2008-22, calling for applications for broadcasting licences to carry on radio programming undertakings to serve London and Guelph, Ontario.

In response to these calls, the Commission has received a number of applications for licences to serve these markets.

Some of these applications are technically mutually exclusive. These applications are:

For London

Items 2 to 5 and 8 are technically mutually exclusive proposing the use of the frequency 98.1 MHz.

Items 6 and 7 are technically mutually exclusive proposing the use of the frequency 91.1 MHz.

These applications, along with item 1 will be treated as competitive radio applications for London.

For item 9, given the proximity of St. Thomas to London, this application will also be considered as part of the competitive phase of the hearing where the Commission will consider the London new radio applications.

For Guelph

Items 10, 11 and 13 are technically mutually exclusive proposing the use of the frequency 101.5 MHz.

These applications, along with item 12 will be treated as competitive radio applications for Guelph.

The Commission intends to consider, subject to interventions, items 14 to 23 during the non-appearing phase of the public hearing.

Application by **Rogers Broadcasting Limited** (Rogers) (2008-0856-1) seeking authority to acquire the assets of the radio programming undertaking CFDR Dartmouth, Nova Scotia from Newcap Inc., and for the issuance of a new licence.

The two applications were filed in the context of a proposed exchange of radio assets between Rogers and Newcap pursuant to a Letter of Intent.

Pursuant to the Letter of Intent, Rogers would purchase the assets of CFDR Dartmouth for \$7 million and Newcap would purchase the assets of CIGM Sudbury for \$2 million.

Pursuant to the *Commercial Radio Policy 2006* (Public Notice CRTC 2006-158, 15 December 2006), Rogers proposes tangible benefits of \$420,000 for the Dartmouth station (CFDR) over a seven-year period, representing 6% of the \$7 million. Similarly, Newcap will contribute a total of \$120,000 for the Sudbury station (CIGM) over a seven-year period, representing 6% of the \$2 million.

Both Rogers and Newcap are also requesting a licence to continue the operation of the undertaking they are acquiring under the same terms and conditions as those in effect under the current respective licence, upon surrender of the licences of CFDR currently issued to Newcap and CIGM currently issued to Rogers.

Rogers and Newcap also filed, under separate cover, applications to respectively convert CFDR Dartmouth (2008-0855-3) and CIGM Sudbury (2008-0857-9) from the AM band to the FM band.

The applicants indicated that, although the conversion applications are severable from the ownership transactions, a denial could impact the negotiated terms of the Letter of Intent.

Additional information will be placed on the public examination file as it becomes available. The Commission encourages interested parties to monitor the public examination file and the Commission's web site for additional information that they may find useful when preparing their comments.

The distribution on a discretionary basis on the licensee's digital service of a second set of U.S. 4+1 signals is subject to the provision that, with respect to such signals, the licensee adhere to the requirements regarding non-simultaneous program deletion set out in section 43 of the *Broadcasting Distribution Regulations*. The Commission may suspend the application of this provision, with respect to the signals to be distributed, upon its approval of an executed agreement between the licensee and broadcasters. Such an agreement must deal with issues related to the protection of program rights arising in connection with the discretionary carriage of a second set of U.S. 4+1 signals and distant Canadian signals solely on the licensee's digital service.

c) The licensee may, at its option, insert certain promotional material as a substitute for the "local availabilities" (i.e., non-Canadian advertising material) of non-Canadian satellite services. At least 75% of these local availabilities must be made available for use by licensed Canadian programming services for the promotion of their respective services, for the promotion of the community channel and for unpaid Canadian public service announcements. A maximum of 25% of the local availabilities may be used to provide subscribers with information regarding customer service and channel realignments, and for the promotion of discretionary programming services and packages, cable FM service, additional cable outlets and non-programming services, including Internet and telephone services.
