Application by **My Broadcasting Corporation** (MBC) relating to the licence of the English-language commercial radio programming undertaking CHMY-FM Renfrew, Ontario.

The licensee proposes to change the authorized contours of its transmitter CHMY-FM-1 Arnprior by decreasing the effective radiated power from 1,000 watts to an average effective radiated power of 790 watts, by increasing the effective antenna height and by relocating the transmitter (maximum effective radiated power 2,500 watts/effective antenna height of 105 metres).

MBC advises that the Corporation of the Town of Arnprior strongly suggested that a new site for its antenna system be found. MBC further states that there are difficult pockets of the community in which to get a clear signal and it has found a suitable existing tower structure located on Mount Pakenham that is of a height that will provide the proper coverage to the community.

MBC notes that its intent is to solely focus on increasing the service to the community of Arnprior.

The authorized contours of the transmitter CHMY-FM-1 will be changed significantly resulting from the above proposed technical changes.
