Application by **Radio communautaire du Labrador Inc.** to amend the broadcasting licence for the Type A French-language community radio programming undertaking CJRM-FM Labrador City.

The licensee proposes to add an FM transmitter in La Grand'Terre to broadcast the programming of CJRM-FM in order to better serve the francophone population of La Grand'Terre.

The transmitter would operate on frequency 96.1 MHz (channel 241A1) with an average effective radiated power of 42 watts (maximum effective radiated power of 250 watts with an effective height of the antenna above average terrain of -17.6 metres).

The licensee states that, with the exception of the services offered by the Canadian Broadcasting Corporation, its service would be the only French service available to the French population of La Grand'Terre.

2. **St-John's, Newfoundland and Labrador**

Application by **Radio communautaire du Labrador Inc.** to amend the broadcasting licence for the Type A French-language community radio programming undertaking CJRM-FM Labrador City.

The licensee proposes to add an FM transmitter in St-John's to broadcast the programming of CJRM-FM in order to better serve the francophone population of St-John's.

The transmitter would operate on frequency 95.7 MHz (channel 239A1) with an effective radiated power of 232 watts (non-directional antenna with an effective height of the antenna above average terrain of 29.4 metres).

The licensee states that, with the exception of the services offered by the Canadian Broadcasting Corporation, its service would be the only French service available to the French population of St-John's.

Application by **CIAM Media & Radio Broadcasting Association** relating to the broadcasting licence for the low-power English-language Type B community radio programming undertaking CIAM-FM Fort Vermilion, Alberta.

The licensee proposes to amend the technical parameters of its transmitter CIAM-FM-14 Wabasca by changing the antenna site and by decreasing the effective height of the antenna above average terrain from 63.25 to 50 metres. All other technical parameters remain unchanged.

The licensee states that it has to change the location of its antenna due to a lack of tower space on the tower structure it had initially proposed.

A true copy must be sent to the applicant, and proof that this has been done must accompany the intervention sent to the Commission.

The Commission advises those who file and serve by electronic mode to exercise caution when using e-mail for service of documents or notification, as it may be difficult to establish that service has occurred.

Parties must ensure, before initiating service through electronic mode, that they will be able to satisfy the Commission, upon request, that service of the notification was completed.

Each paragraph of the document should be numbered.

Interventions should clearly identify the application referred to and indicate whether parties support or oppose the application, or, if they propose changes to it, include the facts and grounds for their proposal.
