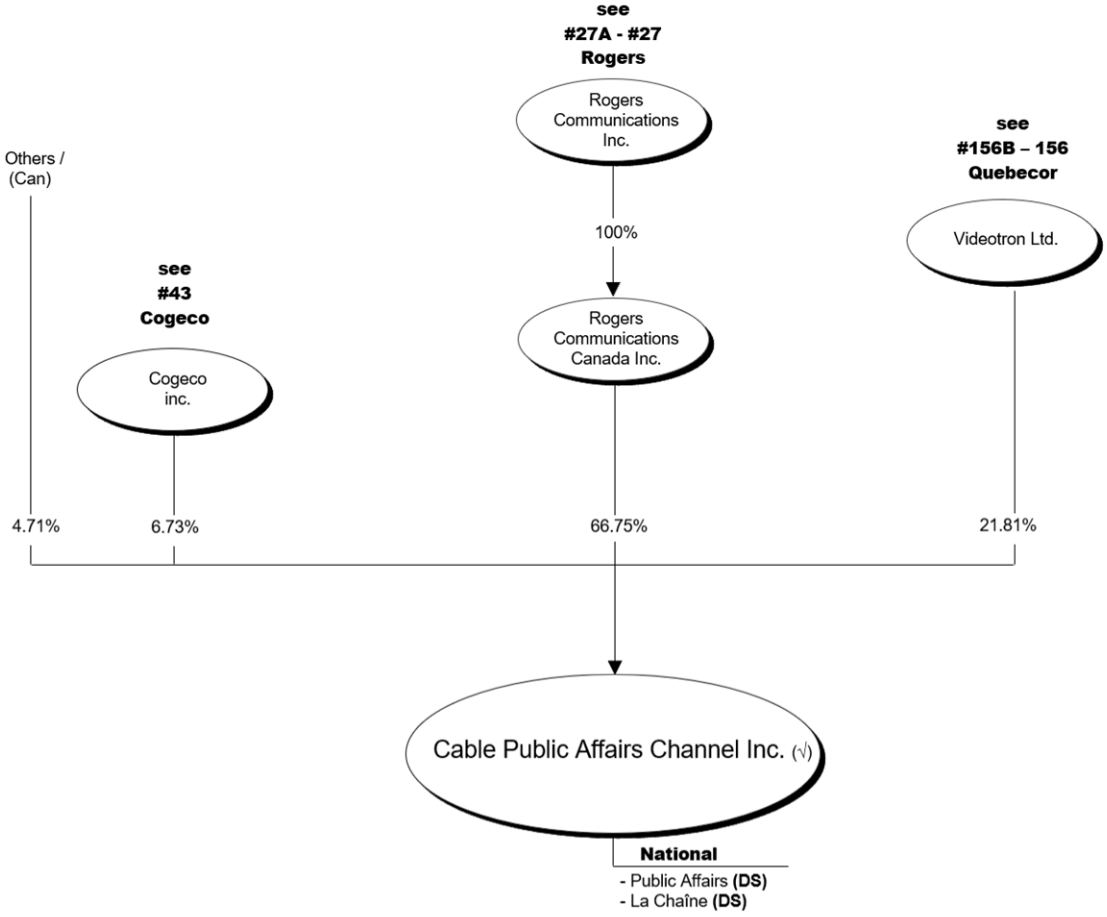

Cable Public Affairs Channel Inc. (CPAC) is held as follows:

- 66.75% by Rogers Communications Canada Inc. which in turn is 100% held by Rogers Communications Inc. (see charts 27 and 27A)
- 21.81% by Videotron Ltd. (see charts 156 and 156B)
- 6.73% by Cogeco inc. (see chart 43)
- 4.71% by other Canadian shareholders
